The Continental Tour criss-crosses the globe and each of the six (6) continental geographical areas to encompass more than 100 meetings throughout the world across the three categories.

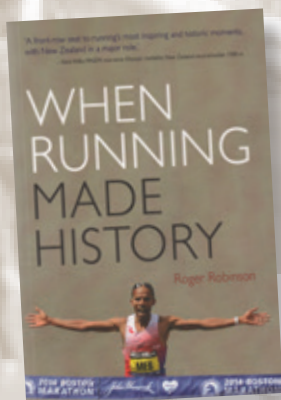

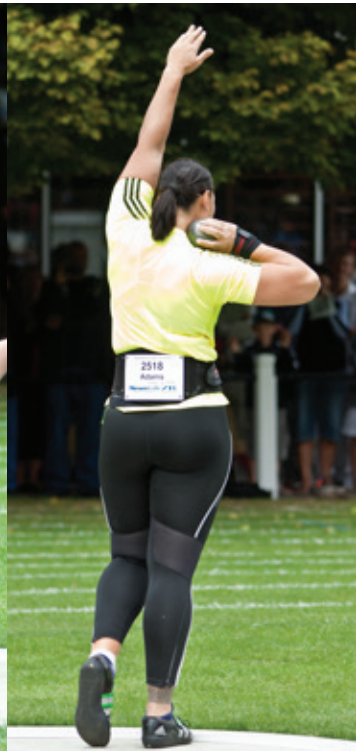

Matt Denny

(AUS) - Discus - PB 68.43m

Matt Denny was an outstanding thrower from a very young age initially competing in both Hammer and Discus in which he represented Australia at the World Youth (u18) Championships - winning the discus and placing 3rd in the hammer. He continued to compete in both disciplines right up until the 2018 Gold Coast Commonwealth Games where he placed 4th in the discus and 2nd in the hammer. From 2019 he has specialised in the Discus, winning the 2022 Commonwealth Games title in between finishing 4th at the Tokyo Olympics and the 2023 World Champs in Hungary. Denny made up for the disappointment of the World Champs where the lead changed several times in the last 2 rounds by winning the season ending Diamond League final.



Tomohiro Shinno

(JAP) - High Jump - PB 2.31m

Tomohiro Shinno is arguably the best of an outstanding crop of Japanese high jumpers. With 8 men ranked inside the top 50 in the world and 5 of them competing here this afternoon the vertical jump will be a must see spectacle. Tomohiro has a personal best of 2.31m and finished 8th at the Oregon World Champs in 2022. More recently he placed 3rd at the Asian Championships in October. With a current season best of 2.29m Tomohiro will be chasing the automatic Olympic qualifying mark of 2.33m but also conscious of the threat of his fellow countrymen with a maximum of 3 being able to qualify for Paris. Currently ranked 18th in the world, the placing points from this Bronze meet could also prove extremely valuable.

Vanessa Sterckendries

(BEL) - Hammer - PB 69.91m

Five times the Belgian hammer champion, Vanessa Sterckendries is travelling the world chasing her Olympic dream. With a personal best of 69.91m, just below the magical 70m barrier for hammer throwers, Vanessa will be looking to gain some valuable qualification points towards Paris as she takes on NZ's own Lauren Bruce. Currently ranked 27th in the world and with the top 32 qualifying for the Olympics, a top placing and good distance will be essential to Vanessa's plans for August. She won't have it all her own way however, with Bruce having already thrown well over 70m this season and Japan's Raika Murakami (Ranked 42nd) also in the field. Look for some fireworks early in the meet with the combined men's and women's Hammer competition one of the first events.



Ella Connolly

(AUS) - 100 & 200m - PB 22.95s

Outstanding Australian sprinter Ella Connolly is one of a large number of Australian sprinters knocking on the door of Olympic qualifying. The Australian sprint relay programme has provided a huge incentive for many of their sprinters to achieve World and Olympic representation. Connolly burst on to the scene as an 18 year old placing 4th in the 400m at the World U20s championship and helping Australia to a silver medal in the 4 x 400m relay. She has since moved down in distance to concentrate more on the 200m and 100m and was in the Bronze medal winning Australian 4 x 100m team at the Birmingham Commonwealth Games. With a sub 23s 200m to her name and a recent 11.26s 100m, Ella will start as one of the favourites in both the 100 and 200m events at ITM.

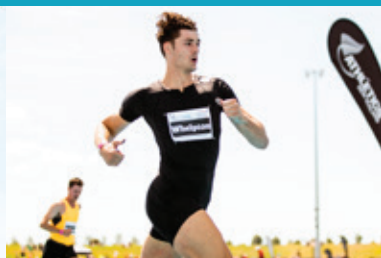

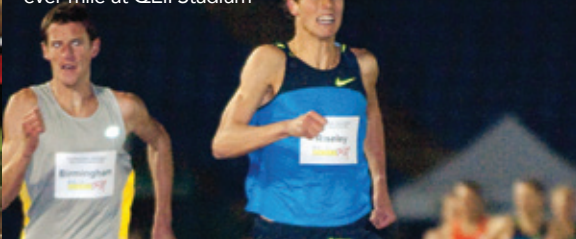

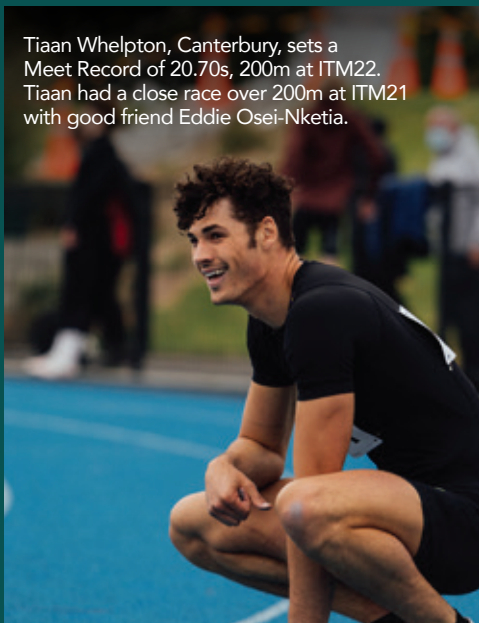
