And of course, we'll see our crowd favourite relay events featuring boys and girls from local clubs aged from 10 to 13, as well as the open relays which will include our ever popular Secondary Schools Challenge.

All of this is part of our commitment to providing a development pathway for those aspiring to follow in the footsteps of Hamish Kerr and Tom Walsh, and go all the way from local athletics to the very top of world track & field.

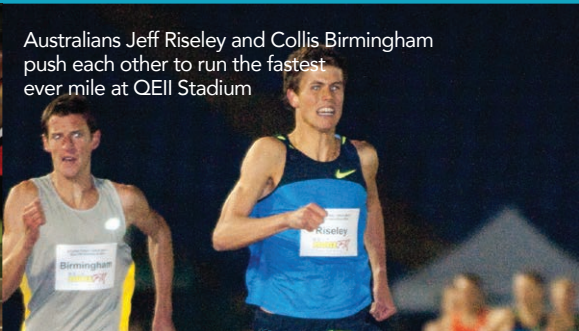
